



#### THE ADVENT WREATH

Advent is the period of four Sundays and weeks before Christmas (or sometimes

from the 1st December to Christmas Day!). Advent means "coming" in Latin. This is the coming of Jesus into the world.



THE WREATH itself, which is made of various evergreens,

signifies continuous life. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life we find in Christ. THE FOUR CAN-DLES represents the four weeks of Advent, and one candle is lit each Sunday. Three of the candles are purple because the color violet is a liturgical color that signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. The first candle, which is purple, symbolizes hope. The third candle is pink and symbolizes joy.
